DIRECTIONS TO WALKS

FRIDAYS 10:30 AM

March 6: Cliff Gilker Park

Cliff Gilker Park is on the north side of Highway 101, just east of the Sunshine Coast Golf Club in Roberts Creek. Follow the winding road once in the park until you arrive at the parking lot by the washrooms.

March 13: Bonniebrook/Esplanade, Gibsons

From Sechelt follow Highway 101 towards Gibsons. Turn right onto Veterans Road. Turn Right onto Fitchett Road. Turn left at the 1st cross street onto King Road. Turn right onto Chaster Road and then a slight right onto Grandview Road. Turn left onto 7th Street and turn right at the 1st cross street onto Gower Point Road. Turn right onto Ocean Beach Esplanade.

March 20: Smuggler's Cove

The Provincial Park is signposted from Hwy 101. Heading north on Hwy 101 turn left onto Brooks Road which is 1 km north of Halfmoon Bay. Drive on Brooks Road approximately 3.5 km from highway. You will see signage for the park. There is a parking lot at the trail head & this is where we will meet.

March 27: The "Record" Loop, Halfmoon Bay

Take Highway 101 north of Sechelt. After about only 200 m past the end of Trout Lake, turn right onto **Trout Lake Road** where you will quickly find a smaller gravel parking area on the right-hand side. The trail head is directly across from the parking area.

April 3: Kinnikinnick Park

Meet at the parking area on Ripple Way across from the Blue Ocean Golf Course. To get to the end of Ripple Way, follow Highway 101 into the community of Sechelt. Turn right on Trail Avenue which will turn into Reef Road. At Shoal Way take a left and then right on Lookout Avenue. On Ripple Way take a left and continue past the Golf Course and onto Kinnikinnick Park.

April 10: Hidden Grove

Follow Sechelt Inlet Road for about 6 kms from downtown Sechelt. Pass Porpoise Bay Provincial Park and continue along Sechelt Inlet Road for about 5 minutes. Hidden Grove is on the right hand side just before the Sandy Hook sign. Meet at the kiosk in the parking area.

April 17: Chapman Falls

On the Sunshine Coast Hwy/Hwy 101 turn up Selma Park Road in Selma Park. (Turn right if coming from Gibsons; turn left if coming from Sechelt). Follow the road to the top where there is room to park cars. The trailhead is at the top of Selma Park Road.

April 24: Soames Hill Park, Gibsons

One can choose to climb to the top of Soames Hill to take in the vistas of Lower Gibsons & Georgia Strait & beyond or follow an easier, lower route through stands of Douglas Fir & cedar.

From the traffic light at the junction of Highway 101 and North Road in Gibsons, proceed 1.9 kms along North Road toward the Langdale ferry terminal. Turn right onto Chamberlin Road and after 200 metres turn left onto Bridgeman Road. 300 metres along Bridgeman is the park entrance.

May 1: Triangle Lake

Directions from Sechelt. Follow the coast highway towards Halfmoon Bay. Park your cars in the first roadside parking bay, alongside Trout Lake. We will meet there and then walk across the highway to the Triangle Lake Trailhead.

May 8: Halfmoon Bay/Connor Park, Northwood Road

Take Highway 101 north of Sechelt, turn left onto the first turnoff for Redrooffs Road (south end). Continue 2.5 kms, turn right onto Fawn Road, continue 1.5 kms, turn right onto Eastwood Road, continue to the end, go left (only choice) onto Northwood Road. The Connor Park parking lot is just past the Halfmoon Bay Elementary School on the right.

May 15: Roberts Creek Falls

From Sechelt: Follow the highway towards Roberts Creek and turn left on Roberts Creek Road at the traffic lights. Roberts Creek Road becomes Lockyer Road. Follow the road and turn right onto Day Road, which is just after the mailboxes. Continue on to the end of Day Road where you can park your car.

May 23: LONG WEEKEND - NO WALK PLANNED

May 29: Burnett Falls & Angus Creek/Porpoise Bay

At the main intersection in Sechelt (Hwy 101 and Wharf Road), turn north on Wharf Road. At the next stop sign, take a left onto Sechelt Inlet Road and then drive to Burnett Road and turn right. The trail head to Burnett Falls is up the road.
